

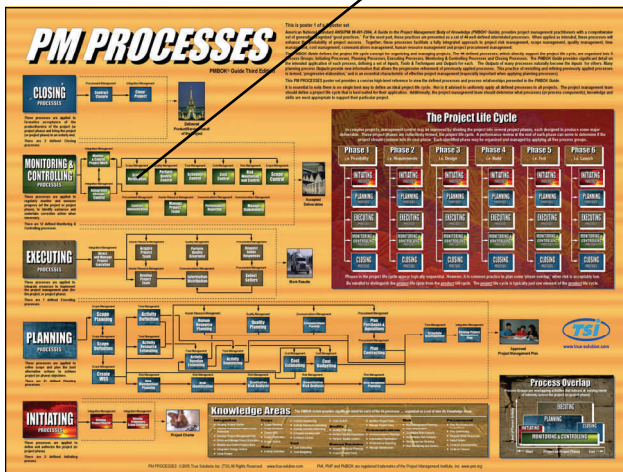
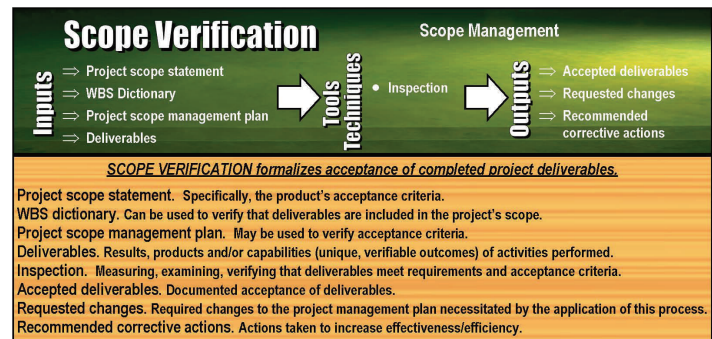


## Applying the Scope Verification Process

Scope Verification is the process of obtaining formal acceptance of project deliverables. It must be understood that a project deliverable is not complete until it has been formally accepted, by the individual or group of individuals authorized to accept it.

Scope verification differs from quality control. Quality control focuses on the *correctness* of work. Scope verification focuses on *formal acceptance* of the work. In practice, both are performed in parallel.

Formal acceptance should be documented.



## Scope Verification Must Know Concepts

1. “Scope Verification is the process of obtaining formal acceptance of project deliverables.”
2. “The primary deliverable (*Output*) of the Scope Verification process is accepted deliverables.”
3. “A project deliverable is not complete until it has been formally accepted, in writing by the individual or group of individuals authorized to accept it.”
4. “Scope verification differs from quality control. Quality control focuses on the correctness of work. Scope verification focuses on formal acceptance of the work.”
